Will there be Breakfast Club?	Yes . The school has been split into 4 big groups and we will provide a breakfast club for each group. Breakfast Club must be booked and paid a minimum of a week in advance. If we cancel breakfast club you will not be charged however if your child does not attend the charge will remain as we will already have arranged the staff and have to pay them whether you turn up or not, you can amend the bookings up to 5 working days before to avoid being charged. Breakfast club will start from Monday 7 th September. Children will not be admitted to breakfast club after 8:25 (N-Yr2) / 8:45 (Yr3-6). To amend/change an advanced booking you must call the school office. This cannot be done online.

If we cannot provide a club you will not be charged however if you change your mind the charge will remain as we will already have arranged the staff and have to pay them whether you turn up or not. You can amend the bookings up to 5 working days before to avoid being charged. To amend/change an advanced booking you must call the school office. This cannot be done online. There will only be limited after school clubs in each phase group until further notice and there will only be 2 pick-up times for each phase group (See below we will not be able to accommodate mid-session pick-ups as the clubs will be scattered across the school. After-school Clubs will start from Monday 7th September.

What if my child is showing Covid symptoms?	It is your responsibility to check that your child is well before you bring them into school. If they have a new cough (this means coughing a lot for more than an hour), a temperature or a loss of taste/smell please keep your child at home and arrange for a test to be completed. Please let the school know the result of the test as we have to notify Public Health England of cases of coronavirus (you will be sent a letter or email, please share this with us)
	If the test is negative your child can return to school when they feel well.
	If the test is positive then you must self-isolate for at last 7 days and your household and support bubble must self-isolate for 14 days from when the child started self-isolating.
	If your test is null and void you must arrange a further test.
	If a child starts to show symptoms at school they will be isolated in the first aid room and sent home as soon as possible. The member of staff looking after them will wear full PPE until the child has been sent home. The first aid room will then be thoroughly cleaned.

outbreak at school/in the local area?	If there is a positive test result in a class the class will close until all the children have been tested. We will alert Public Health England who will likely organise test, track and trace for the group/school. If there is a local lockdown we will follow the local government.
What will the school do to keep my child as safe as is possible?	The school will do everything it can to minimise the risk of infection to all staff and children. Your child will be in their classroom with their class and will be part of a larger phase group that have playtimes and lunchtimes together. The seating arrangements in the classroom and lunch hall will change so that children are not facing each other. The rooms will be well ventilated and communal high touch areas will be cleaned more regularly. All children will have their own resources (pens, pencils, rulers etc.) and will share a tub of maths resources with their partner) Staff will work across phase groups only and will not cross over into other phase groups. Pupils will be encouraged to wash and sanitise hands regularly throughout the day. The start times and entrances will be staggered as will play times and lunchtimes to ensure different groups do not mix with each other. We know that some parents will have children in different phase groups and this is unavoidable. As a school we are doing everything we can within the restrictions we are faced with. Guidance may be updated throughout the summer – we will let you know of any changes when we return in September.

	may include some intervention or 1:1 group work.

Will there be parents' evening?	Yes. Parents' evenings will be held using a virtual platform. You will be given a
	choice of days/times and then sent an invitation by your class teacher.
Will school be serving lunches?	Yes. If your child receives free school meals, universal free school meals (Rec-
	Y2) or you pay for lunch the school kitchen will provide alternating hot meals
	and packed lunches. (1 week hot meals, 1 week packed lunch etc.) this is
	because lunchtimes are staggered and we cannot provide a hot lunch for all children within the limited time and space that we have.
Can my child bring a packed lunch?	Yes. Your child can bring their own lunch but it must be in a paper bag that can
	be disposed of each day, not a packed lunch bag, to minimise cross infection
	from school to home.
