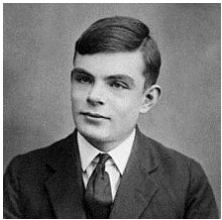

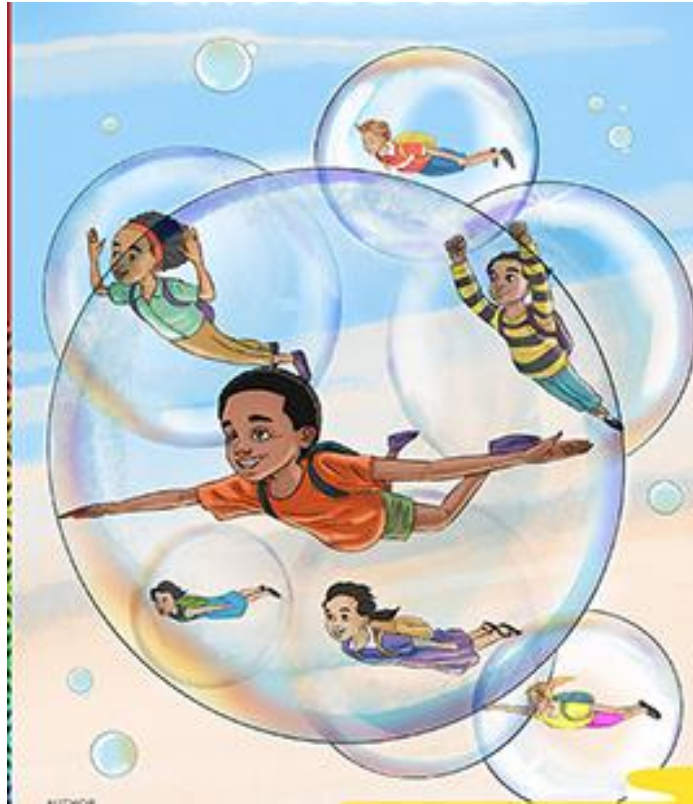

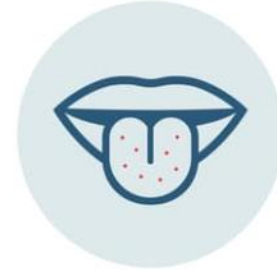

- Numbers to 10,000 R
- Numbers to 100,000 R
- Numbers to a million R
- Numbers to ten million
- Compare and order any number
- Round numbers to 10, 100 and 1,000 R
- Round any number
- Negative numbers

Many children may struggle to work immediately with numbers to 10,000,000 so we are suggesting that this might build up from smaller numbers.

It's vital that children have that understanding/recap of place value to ensure they are going to be successful with later number work.

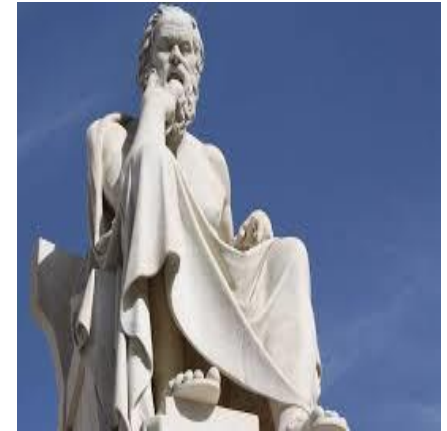

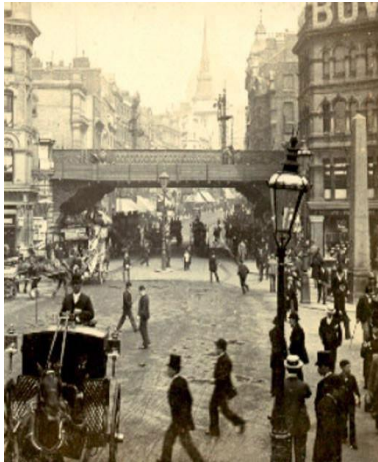

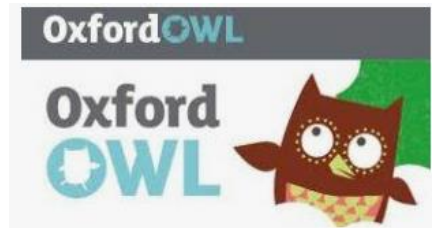

Welcome back to Millfields and welcome to Year 6. We can't wait to see your projects and how you have chosen to present your learning. You can have lots of mini projects across different areas or one main project to present. Try to be as creative and imaginative as possible.

You have to be ready to present your learning to our class!

Your homework should:

- Be representative of a term's work (**at least 10 weeks**)
- Explore lots of different ways of showing your learning (photos, video, computer presentation, posters, 3D, art)
- Involve different ways of finding information and remember to write this up alongside your project
- Be creative and imaginative
- Show that you've developed your own interests.

Possible Places to visit: Lot's of places are re-opening- check the website though before you go!

Charles Dickens Museum, Leighton House Museum, Dennis Sever's House, William Morris Gallery, Museum of London, Huntarian Museum, Sherlock Holmes museum

OR Just go for a walk around London! There are plenty of London landmarks dating back to this era. The Victorians were great builders; among the iconic central London structures erected during the reign of Queen Victoria are the Houses of Parliament, Tower Bridge, Trafalgar Square and Nelson's Column, the Royal Courts of Justice and the National Portrait Gallery. To the west, the museum district of South Kensington is another place where you can immerse yourself in Victoriana.

History and Geography:

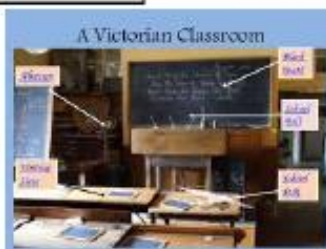
- Compare Victorian London to present day London

- Do some fieldwork at a site of the River Thames or research and report how its use and levels of pollution have changed since the Victorian times
- Research into Barnado's

Science:

- Explore famous scientists from the Victorian era
- Write a report on a famous Victorian Scientist
- Investigate what diseases were prevalent during Victorian times and why the spread so easily

Art & D&T:

- Create a 3D Victorian classroom
- Create a 3D Victorian section of London
- Paint a picture of a Victorian setting
- Create a project on a Victorian artist
- Paint a portrait of a Victorian chimney sweep, pickpocket or a famous Victorian e.g. Oscar Wilde, Sherlock Holmes, Jack the Ripper
- Design and make a Victorian toy
- Create a diorama of a Victorian scene
- Create a board game to develop our knowledge of the Victorians

Millfields Musical Magnificence

It has been another busy week at Millfields, especially for all our cycling community! Lots of the Year 5 children have been taking part in Bikeability lessons — learning how to have a road-worthy bike and how to ride safely on the roads. Well done to all the children who successfully completed the course. Yesterday, 36 of the Year 5 children also took part in Bike Around the Borough — an event that takes place every year! Hundreds of Hackney school children take to the roads for a mass ride around the borough, organised by the Council to provide a chance for students to practice the skills they've learned through national standards cycle training and to help them see how easy it is to travel around Hackney by bike. The rides started at Hackney Downs, travelling from there to Clissold Park, before heading on to London Fields, past Hackney Town Hall and back to Hackney Downs. Then today, many of our Cycling Team have taken part in a sponsored cycle ride — they did the last 10 miles of a 50 mile ride and have so far raised an amazing £1,750. Thanks to all the families and friends who have donated. They had beautiful weather today and cycled up the towpath to Ware. They hope to reach their target of £1950 by the end of today in order to raise money for World Bicycle Relief that will provide 20 bikes for children to ride to school in poorer countries across the world. 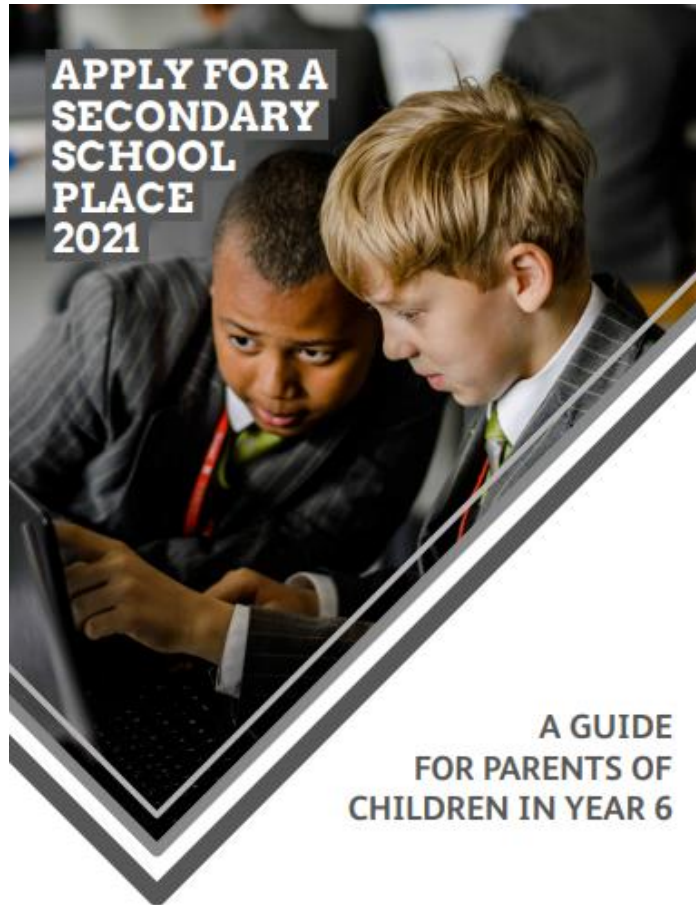

Secondary Transfer Parent Briefings ** NEW **

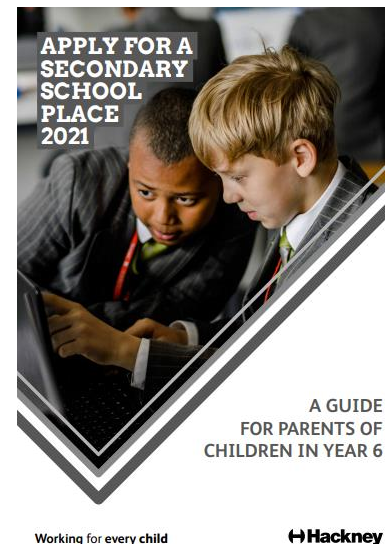
The school admissions team is hosting online information sessions about secondary transfer.

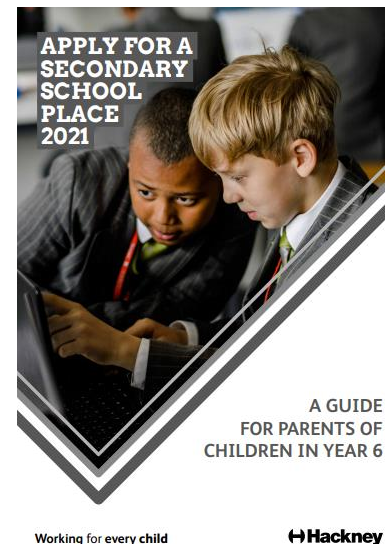
The program of open events was published in June (education.hackney.gov.uk/openevents)
