Business As Usual at Millfields!



Welcome back to everyone! All the children are very happy to be back in school, they looked well-rested and ready for the busy summer term!

You may have noticed, or your children may have told you that we have a new green

structure/shed with a chimney attached in the playground! This is a new 'temporary' boiler that was installed over the break, which will be in situ until we get a new energy-saving heat pump system (that takes energy from outside and transfers it into heat to be circulated around a heating and hot water system) which will be in the next 12-18 months. So while we wait for the new one, we have had to have the old boilers from the basement removed and a new temporary one has been installed that is actually in the playground -you cannot miss it when you come in the main gate! Of course, I am not overly happy about this situation, along with the scaffolding, but as always we will make the most of the situation!

You may be able to help -we are looking for some volunteers to paint and decorate the hoarding around it to make it more appealing and maybe useful for playtimes. Any suggestions or volunteers with an artistic flair welcome! Just come and have a chat!

This week, teachers have been introducing the new learning for this term and there is a real buzz around the school about William Shakespeare! Each year-group is studying a different Shakespeare play or poem, and there has been a lot of great role play, brilliant orating, puppet making and fantastic character and setting descriptions. Some of the plays being read are Julius Caesar, The Tempest, Romeo and Juliet, Midsummer Night's Dream and The Winter's Tale. The children in Y1 know lots of facts about Shakespeare too. He was born in Stratford upon Avon, he died on 23rd April in 1616, his plays were on stage at The Globe Theatre and lots more. I am looking forward to reading some of the children's rewrites of the plays and scripts in the next few weeks!

As part of the start to all our Humanities topics, lots of classes have been out on trips and taken part in workshops. Y2 visited Hampstead Heath and did a workshop 'Mad about Maps' and fieldwork while learning to use maps as part of their unit of work called 'Navigate this!' Y4 classes visited Hackney Museum to hear 'Suitcase Stories' as part of their local History work, looking at how Hackney has changed over time. Year 4 also visited Stepney City Farm as part of our work with Empathy Animals (<a href="https://creativecommons.org/linearing-new-maps-align: red commons.org/linearing-new-maps-align: red commons.

www.empathyanimals.org/), who are developing a new programme based around children and their relationship and understanding of animals. Year 1 went on a great visit to Monument as part of their History work on the Great Fire of London, which brought the whole story to life, as well as being treated to a brilliant Sharing Assembly by Tarrant Class. They acted, sang and spoke so well, and have really immersed themselves in the story of the Great Fire of London. Well done to all the children, and to Bruno and Sardier! It was such a lovely start to our Friday morning!

On Friday 5th May, we will be having our Millfields celebration to mark the King's Coronation the following day. This day we will be doing a couple of activities about the King's life and his journey to the throne, and this will culminate in a celebration picnic, with live music, in the playground, that will take place during the usual lunch time. We are asking everyone to dress in their party clothes for a celebration on that day. We will also send a letter about the special picnic lunch that will be available (for the price of a school meal) for all children to have, including the morning Nursery. This letter will come via SCOpay and you can book and pay for it on Scopay too.

A few reminders - please make sure that your child arrives at school on time as there are lots of children missing the first session that is often phonics or reading and this slows down progress; also please wear the correct clothing for PE - shorts and t-shirts in school colours - white, blue or black please, and no football shirts


