What a wonderful sight this morning seeing all of the children and adults wearing their pyjamas to school!! Thank you everyone for such a brilliant effort – we have raised more than £525 so far! We have such a wonderful school community who are always so generous and continue to contribute to all the fundraising that we take part in - thank you! A very special 'thank you' to Dougal, Tova's Dad (Shenandoah Class) who organised another fantastic firework display last Saturday night at Millfields Park for the children at Millfields, Rushmore and the local community. The event raised lots of money - more than £2,000 for Millfields which has kindly been donated to the school - thank you so much to all of you who went along and for your donations! This money will help with

some of the consumables and other little things that enhance the curriculum. It has been a very busy week at Millfields with so much learning, lots of visitors, trips, workshops and dressing up! It is Anti-bullying Week and there have been lots of discussions and work in classes around this year's theme: 'choose respect'. The Anti-Bullying Alliance definition of bullying is 'The repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group, where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. Bullying can be physical, verbal or psychological. It can happen face to face or online.'

The week included focussed assemblies and lessons and started with us all wearing odd socks on Tuesday, celebrating the fact that we are all different and that is a good thing! Thank you to everyone for getting into the spirit! The assemblies talked about the fact that respect means to have due regard for (someone's feelings, wishes, or rights). We have really encouraged the children to talk to an adult about anything that is worrying them, and especially if there is something that is making them feel uncomfortable or sad, or if they believe that they are being bullied. This week always brings up many worries and things that the children want to talk about. This is what it is all about - tackling any bullying and letting children know that it is not acceptable! So please talk to your child at home, and get in touch if they and you have any worries, especially around any online worries! The children know that they can talk to any adult at school, and that we will make sure their voice is heard. The children voiced the need to show everyone respect and to treat others as you would expect to be treated.

As part of this week, Y5 children were very excited to go on a trip to the Apollo Theatre in Victoria to watch the musical 'Wicked'. This was a fantastic opportunity for our children, many who had never been to a theatre before to experience a big West End show and enjoy the magic of live musical theatre. The feedback was all very, very positive, so thank you so much to all the staff, and to the parents who went along to support this trip, and of course to Vicky for organising everything to make it happen.

Well done to all the Y5 and Y6 cyclists who took part in the 2nd Cycling League race at Mabley Green yesterday. The children all tried very hard and raced well! BIG WELL DONE to all of them, and thanks to Nishie and parent, Saga for supporting them!

On the topic of bikes, we are having a few issues with the way that bikes and scooters are being stored at the beginning of the day and then picked up at the end of the day. So, from Monday, there will be signs up to indicate where each year group should park their bikes, and a specific area for children who will be attending After-school Clubs. Please do try to follow this and ensure that bikes and scooters are not being damaged or moved/lost. Thanks in advance for your help and support here!

Also this week, Millfields hosted an event with Ashoka Org (<u>https://www.ashoka.org/en-gb/time-for-change</u>) to premiere our Democracy Week film to an audience of other Head teachers and educational professionals from across the country. The film showcases the fantastic work, learning and participation behind democracy week at Millfields, and the journey to elect our own Prime Minister and cabinet. Our Co Prime Ministers for this year, John and Safi, along with Deputy Tessa, spoke to the room and were very well received for their passion and commitment. A HUGE well done to them. 


PSA After-school Tuck Shops — Autumn 2024






