Going away with the children on any trip is one of my favourite things to do, and I loved being with Y5 on this residential trip. A huge 'thank you' to the staff at Kench Hill, and also to our staff - Shevenne, Emma, Claire, Debi, Isabelle, Tom and Dudley.

The Y5 back in school also had lots to do this week! They had lots of Art and PE sessions, had a bowling trip on Wednesday, and they also enjoyed playing a range of board and card games, before designing and making their own! There were some great efforts and will be in classes to be played during wet play and free time for the rest of term.

Today, we were also treated to 2 brilliant sharing assemblies - the children in both classes, Kilimanjaro and Douro were brilliant. They had all learned their lines, and delivered them well, worked together, supported each other and entertained and educated the parents and carers who came. Well done to them all, and thank you to all the parents who came in. Thank you also to the parents who came in to read in class in Y1 and Y2 today - this happens every Friday, so please try to pop in at 8:50am next week!

Reception children visited Woodberry Wetlands this week as part of their topic work and took part in pond-dipping and minibeasts exploration. The children had a great time, even though it was very wet for Shannon Class, and they found lots of interesting minibeasts. Y6 classes also visited Bruce Castle Museum for a workshop about life in Victorian times. This was very useful and has supported in class learning too.

A BIG well done to all the Y5 and Y6 cyclists who braved the cold yesterday to take part in the Mountain Bike racing at Mabley Green. This was the 5th cycle event of the season and the children did so well despite the conditions and the points collected kept Millfields at the top of the league! Thanks to Nishie for organising the riders and to Peter for his help.

#### Help the school by registering for Free School Meals

By registering for Free School Meals, you will also allow school to receive PUPIL PREMIUM, which is extra money from the government to support children from families on lower incomes. The funding that school receives can be used for a range of interventions including help with costs of school trips, music fees, after school programmes and equipment.

## Even if your child prefers packed lunch, it is worth registering to receive:

- A discounted place on school trips
- Discounted music tuition
- A £10 shopping voucher per child for each week during school holidays

See if you are entitled... It costs nothing to try, so why not give it a go!


You may also be eligible for additional support via benefits related Free School meals if you are receiving:

- Income Support
- Income Related Employment Support Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income less than £16,190
- Universal Credits (no more that £7,400 take home pay)
- Income Based Job Seekers Allowance
- Guarantee element of State Pension
  Credit
- Support under part VI of the Immigration & Asylum Act 1999
