Remarkable Researchers

- Research WW2 propaganda posters. Make your own in a similar style.
- Visit a WW2 museum e.g. Imperial War Museum, Canterbury Heritage Museum, Kent Battle of Britain Museum or the Spitfire and Hurricane Memorial Museum. Take photos and create a poster showing what you learned.
- Find out what 'Dig for Victory' was, Present your findings in an interesting way.
- Research how WW2 affected your local area,
 You could visit Hackney Museum to help.



- Record a podcast discussing an aspect of World War 2.
- Make a video animation linked to WW2,

Map Challenges

- Make a map of the world showing countries involved in the war. Include details of Allies and Axis powers.
- Find out where children were evacuated from and to in England, Show this on a map.

Wonderful Writers

- Imagine you are an evacuee. Write a letter home to your family explaining what has happened to you.
- Write in role as a soldier to his family about life in the trenches.
- Write a biography of a key person involved in the war e.g. Winston Churchill
- Write a script for a radio news broadcast about a key event during World War 2.
- Write a war based story/poem.
- Research & create a fact file on key events in the war e.g. Battle of Britain, the Blitz, VE day or D-Day. You could present your work in writing, as a poster or in a PowerPoint presentation.





Get Cooking!

- Research rationing and make a ration recipe. Photograph the meal and write out the recipe. Write a review of the meal
- Write a menu using some of the ration recipes you find out about.

Lots of the Year 5 children have been taking part in Bikeability lessons — learning how to have a road-worthy bike and how to ride safely on the roads. Well done to all the children who successfully completed the course. Vesterday, 36 of the Year 5 children also took part in Bike Avound the Borough — an event that takes place every year! Hundreds of Hackney school children take to the roads for a mass ride around the borough, neganised by the Council of provide a chance for students to practice the skills they've learned through national standards cycle training and to help them see how easy it is to travel around Hackney by bike. The nders started at Hackney Downs, travelling from there to Clissold Park, before heading on to London Fields, past Hackney Town Hall and back to Hackney Downs. Then today, many of our Cycling Team have taken part in a sponsored cycle nde — they did the last 10 miles of a 50 mile ride and have so far raised an amazing £1,750. Thanks to all the families and friends who have donated. They had beautiful weather today and cycled up the towpath to Ware. They hope to reach their target of £1550 by the end of today in order to raise money for World Bicycle Relief that will provide 20 bixes for children to ride to school in poorer countries across the world.
