
Democracy Week is not about...



We would like to address a few aspects of the school that we believe will benefit from some changes

Playground

- We will ensure that existing permanent playground equipment such as slides and climbing frames are in good order
- We will ensure that the Play Pod contains fully functioning equipment as per its usual selection, but would request that the range be expanded to include things such as exercise balls
- We want to pursue the idea of a quiet zone, which has been previously planned but never followed through
 We would like to see some more board-style and physical games painted onto the ground to encourage.
- We would like to see some more board-style and physical games painted onto the ground to encourage group play, particularly in the younger years

Lessons / Curriculum

We would like to see an expansion in the range of time-tabled non academic lessons on the curriculum

- We will look to build more craft (hand-making) time into a week, maybe a 20min session as part of a DT-style
 project
- We'are keen to have a weekly growing / gardening lesson so that children can learn how easy it is to grow plants to enjoy, and vegetables to eat
- Following on from the ability to grow their own food, we want to see children encouraged to cook for themselves, and will ask for weekly cooking or food preparation lessons
