Home-School Agreement

The aim of this agreement is to help parents/carers, children and all staff to work well together.

Millfields School will try to:

- Ensure your child achieves their full potential, as a valued member of the school community
- Achieve high standards of work and behaviour through building good relationships and developing a sense of responsibility
- Care for your child's safety and happiness by:
 - Sharing and promoting the values of a Rights Respecting School
 - Maintaining orderly classrooms and playgrounds
 - Monitoring and dealing with bullying and anti-social behaviour when it occurs
 - Listening to children as individuals and via the school council
 - Rewarding good work and behaviour
- Provide a balanced curriculum and meet the needs of your child via:
 - Delivery of the National Curriculum
 - Organising out of school visits linked to their topic when appropriate
 - Promoting and developing extra-curricular activities such as Homework clubs, After-school clubs, Play Club, Breakfast Club, etc.
 - Sending reading books home regularly
- Keeping you informed about school matters via:
 - A leaflet explaining what your child's class will cover each term
 - 'The Millfields Mag' which comes out on Fridays and is always uploaded on to the Millfields website
 - A termly Parents' Evening and/or Curriculum Evening
 - Contacting individual parents when there are serious concerns
- Be open and welcoming at all times and offer opportunities for you to become involved in the daily life of the school as:
 - regular community events that help develop links with parents
 - inviting parents to Sharing Assemblies
 - holding social and fundraising events each term with the Parent Staff Association.
