

WHAT IS THE PSA?

Millfields Community School PSA is the Parent Staff Association of the school. In summary, the PSA aims to organise events and raise funds for the school to improve all aspects of school life for those who learn and work there. The PSA is a fully constituted charitable body. As a parent, carer or member of staff, you already belong to the PSA.

WHO RUNS THE PSA?

The PSA is run by a committee of parents who are voted annually at the Annual General Meeting in October of each year. The current Officeholders are:

We also have a Tuck Shop Co-ordinator - *Vickie Wilkes* (mum to Ila in Rome) and *Thelma Gondwe* (mum to Aajah in Calgary, Oasis in Mexico City & Jahraine in London) organises the Non Uniform Days.

Our Staff Rep left to take up a new post in another school in July; his successor will be appointed shortly.

In addition many parents and staff help organise and run the various events and projects. They are known as the "PSA Regulars" although no one is quite sure why!

We hold meetings several times a term the dates and times of which are advertised widely.

ALL parents and carers are welcome to attend.

HOW MUCH MONEY DO YOU RAISE?

During the academic year 2011-2012 we raised a total of £13,704 in cash. In addition we obtained £12,500 of grant funding (for cycling and the library redevelopment) and during the summer holidays we heard that we had been granted £1500 by Ford and £10,000 from Awards for All towards the Playpod. Finally we raised £1753 commission to spend on books from our Book Fairs. That's a grand total of just under £39,500.

WHAT IS THE MONEY SPENT ON?

The following allocations were made in the academic year 2011-2012:

£3000 towards reading scheme books (final tranche of commitment made by PSA towards this project)

£60 - Baby Belling cooker for speech and language group

£640 - Olympic visits

£8 - goalie gloves for football team

£740 - Horse Riding for ARB children

£2161 - final instalment on playground boat construction

£2000 - contribution to Library refurbishment

£2500 - (figure TBC): contribution to Playpod (dependent on Grant Applications)

 ${\it £}$ 1753 - Scholastic Book Fair commission: books to support topic work and for the library

£2500 - contribution to Playground Design Work

£TBC - contribution to Playground Project Co-Ordinator Role

Volunteer to be one of your class **Tuck Shop Reps** and help to run your class Tuck Shop on a Friday after school a maximum of twice per academic year (all of the parents in the class contribute the Tuck Shop reps are there to remind everyone and run the stall on the day).
