

Year 2 Reading

By the end of year 2 children are expected to be able to:

Read high frequency words without help

Read unknown words by reading on, reading back or sounding out

Read aloud in an interesting and lively way taking note of punctuation

Locate information in the text to answer a simple question about what they have read

Work out what the author is saying about characters or events in the text

Pick out interesting words used by the writer and explain why they think they have used them

Talk about what they like and dislike about a text

Understand the difference between different text types

Know that texts are set in different times and places

You can support your child's development in reading by spending time with them each day and talking about the words and pictures within the books your children bring home from school. It is as important to talk about the cover and the pictures as it is to read the story. The pictures can often support the children in predicting unknown words and if not they can use their phonic knowledge to sound out the words or think about what word would make sense in the sentence. It is also a good idea to join a local library so that you can get a range of books related to areas of personal interest.

Year 2 Writing

By the end of year 2 children are expected to be able to:

Demonstrate consistency in the use of first or third person when writing simple sentences

Use conjunctions to join sentences

Use question marks, exclamation marks and commas in a list accurately

Vary sentence openings

Use past and present tense consistently

Capital letters and full stops used accurately

Sections of writing linked by use of pronouns e.g. he/she instead of repeating name

Adopt the specific style of the text type e.g. use story language when writing a story and formal language in letters

Letters shaped correctly even if there are still inconsistencies in size and use of upper/lower case

Spell high frequency words accurately

There are lots of opportunities for supporting writing at home. Ask your child to help you write the shopping list, keep a family diary or write a diary when you are away on holiday. Children like to write their own stories, so allow them to use the computer and then help them to add pictures and print their work. Make little paper books or purchase special books. Ask children to write their own cards to members of the family.
