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Millfields Busy iDiscovering

Today is Sport Relief, and as ever on non-uniform day, lots of you have dressed up and donated generously to the Sports Relief charity. This week we have been learning about jobs in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths). We have had a brilliant science and technology week working with Inspire on iDiscover Week. The week started with an assembly to get the children interested and enthused in the topics that they would be covering this week. All of the classes had visitors, special videos, workbooks and most had trips to support and enhance the fantastic science and technology work that has been going on in class this week. Activities have included looking at robots and machines, meeting scientists and engineers who visited the class, and using a Cubetto to programme and move robots in class. They met neuroscientists, physiotherapists, biologists and psychologists. Year 3 were looking at the food that we eat to function as humans. They visited a food-related organisation like Spitalfields City farm or Ed's Bakery and then had visits from dietitians, food engineers and drinks technologists. Year 4 had a fantastic time looking at how lighting and sound engineers help theatre productions. The had visits from a range of production engineers and visited the National Theatre to show off their skills! Year 5 and Year 6 had a great time learning how to use the IT programme 'scratch' to design their own computer programme. They had visits from games designers and producers as well as a visit to Cancer Research HQ for the Y6 classes. There was also a Careers Carousel in Year 1 and Year 6; volunteers from a range of professions brought along props or equipment to demonstrate their jobs. Some trips have been postponed until after Easter - we will keep you posted. All of the children have met people that do exciting STEM jobs - we hope that lots of the children at Millfields will be in these kind of jobs in the future. Thank you to Naomi for coordinating all the visitors, trips and activities this week. Please spend some time this weekend talking to your children about the work they have been doing and about all the amazing people they have met!

As you can imagine, the current Coronavirus pandemic has been at the forefront of all our minds over the last few weeks. I hope that you have been keeping up-to-date with the emails that we are sending out that serve as information for you as parents, but also includes child-friendly advice and information for your children. Just an update on what we are doing in school:

- We are keeping all staff informed on a daily basis as advised by DfE and NHS England
- There are updates and information on the school website
- There are posters and hand-washing instructions in each classroom around the school
- There have been assemblies on the symptoms of coronavirus and also on hand-washing
- There is hand wash/soap and blue towel in all classrooms and communal toilets that is checked and replenished at least 3 times a day
- All door handles and bannisters around the school are being wiped/disinfected at least 3 times a day
- All children are being reminded to wash hands and this is facilitated by the class teachers at key points in the day—on entry to school, before play, after play, before lunch, after lunch
- We are asking all visitors to wash/sanitise their hands before coming in to the school building
- We are taking advice daily on different school scenarios such as class trips, visits, sports events and outings Preparation is underway in the event that the school may need to close - this will include workbooks, online access to websites and topic-learning projects, as well as possible provision for free-school meals and breakfast for those families in need. You will be informed of this by text and a letter via email. Please make sure that we have a current email for you as a matter of urgency. Please be assured that we are trying to keep the school open as usual and will continue all lessons and activities to ensure that the children are still enjoying the range of activities and learning we have planned every day. We are trying very hard to ensure that the children are not alarmed or become fearful. Please keep the school informed if any member of your family becomes unwell and is suspected of, or is diagnosed as having contracted Coronavirus. There is detailed quidance available from the government on what to do if family members or visitors have returned to the UK from a Coronavirus 'hotspot'. The NHS 111 website will provide guidance if you are worried that a family member may have come in contact with Coronavirus. If you are concerned about Coronavirus and plan to keep your child off school, please discuss this with the




