This week, the Reception children went on their WOW trip to the Science Museum, to learn more about space as part of their topic. The children had a great adventure and were full of stories on their return to school. They have also been very busy in class and have created rockets as part of their home learning, and made space ships and space stations in class. Also this week, Year 6 classes visited the East London Mosque as part of their work on Islam in RE. Year 2 and Year 4 children had a visit, presentation and question and answer session with Archbishop Evangelou to enhance their understanding of the area of Christianity that they are studying in class. This year we have developed our enrichment provision in RE, so each class has a visit to a place of worship and a visit from a religious leader from one of the main faiths over the course of each academic year. Thanks Naomi — RE Lead, for organising this. As part of our focus on enrichment and cultural experiences, some of the Year 4 and Y5 children went to a school's performance of 'The Madhatter's Tea Party, led by the Royal Opera Company at the Camden Round House. The performance had great reviews and although some of the children said it was very long, it was enjoyed by all!

We have also held 2 meetings about the Year 5 2 night residential trip that is scheduled for 8th and 9th March. Please ask at the main reception for more details or speak to your child's class teacher. Please make an initial payment of £20 to reserve your child's place as soon as you can. This is a special trip that has been organised to bring the Year 5 topic on erosion to life through first hand experiences. We hope you will support us by encouraging your child to take part and attend.

The Year 6 Residential trip is taking place during the first week in June. We are taking payments weekly for this. If you have not signed up and would still like you child to take part, please ask for a letter at the main office and pay a deposit of £50.

Finally, there are several opportunities for parents to see the school in action and take part in workshops to help your child's learning in the next few weeks. Next Tuesday is an opportunity for Year 4 parents to have lunch with their child – please book your place at the main office. There is also an opportunity on Wednesday 25th January at 9am, for Reception and Year 1 parents to see how your child learns to read, and then to have a discussion and ask any questions with Debi — Assistant Head and Literacy Lead. Places for this are limited per class so book early to avoid disappointment.

Finally, thank you to all the parents and carers who do come and speak with me if there are any issues or problems. I think you know that my door is always open so please either book an appointment during Headteacher Surgery or catch me at the school gate.



The Department for Transport's suite of road safety resources for teachers, pupils and parents.




THINK! Education includes a wealth of road safety information and resources for <u>pupils</u>, <u>teachers</u> and <u>parents</u>.
