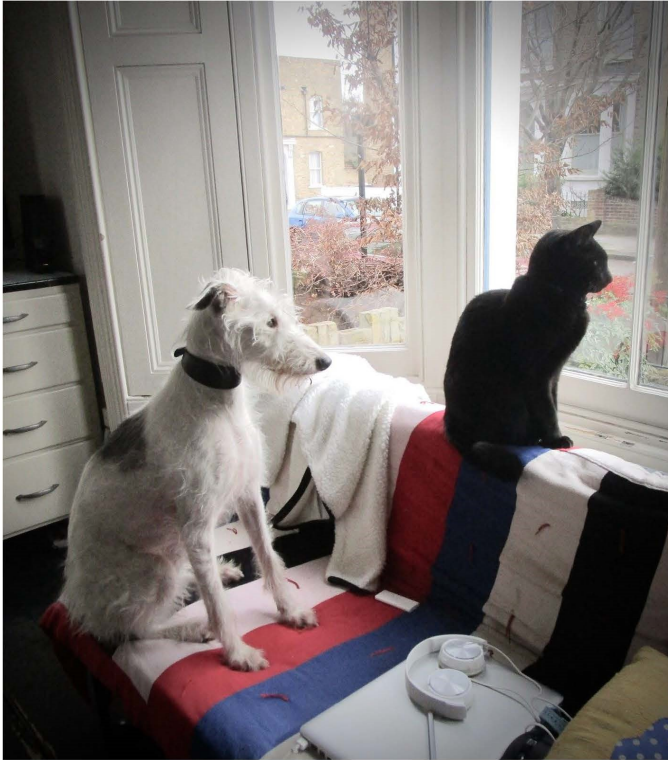

- D) Shoppers through the planting provides an exciting route for small feet over the mound.
- E) Boulders alongside the planted mounds provide a spot to sit and ponder or climb and jump.
