Welcome back to everyone, and I hope you had a good rest and enjoyed your holiday. It is great to see all the children back, looking rested and ready for the busy term ahead. As always, there are lots of special events and theme weeks planned for this half term, so please make sure that you read the Mag, look on the school website, check your mobile number is correct to receive texts and look out for the trip and permission letters that will need signing.

Next week is 'Parents and Families' Week. You should have already received information on a range of events that are taking place next week. The theme for the week is 'Different Families, Same Love'. In class the staff will be taking the oppor-

tunity to talk to your children about the different types of families there are and that our school is a place where every person has the right to be themselves, to be included and to learn in a safe and happy environment. The staff at The British Museum were quite rightly amazed by the children's enthusiasm for learning, their knowledge and their questions. Well done!

Also this week, Year 1 visited the William Morris Gallery as part of their Art curriculum work. The children enjoyed looking around the gallery and also took time to make their own drawings and patterns.

Yesterday, we had 4 teacher visitors from schools in Norway. The teachers wanted to look at how we assess children and what our marking, feedback and next steps in learning look like. They were very impressed with books they looked at, pupils they spoke to and the teaching and learning that they observed in classes. Thank you to all the staff and children for making them feel so welcome.

This term, we are offering parents with children in Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5, the opportunity to have lunch with their child.



- Family Cooking Session: Take part in a cooking workshop with your child and take home something yummy you've made together!
- Smart Talk Online Family Agreement Workshop: Gets parents and kids together for a conversation about being responsible with new technology. Help to create and sign a family agreement with your child to help them stay safe and happy online
- Family Science Workshops: Join your child in a fun exploration based science workshop and learn how to build on your child's curiosity and enhance their engagement in enquiry based learning
- · Bring your Pet and Parent to school: All pets and parents/carers are invited to visit their child's class
- Dads and Lads fire pit singalong: There will be bongos and guitars, a time to bond and have fun
- Family Story Time: Parents and family members are invited to come and read to their child's class

Research shows that family engagement supports success. Children with involved parents and families are more likely to do better at school, come to school regularly, have better social skills and go on to post-secondary education. Family Week is one great way for you to do so.
