

I am so pleased that they have been able to have this experience as they have missed so much of the additional learning experiences due to lockdowns and restrictions. I know they will have a fantastic time.

The children have worked very hard this week, without really knowing in some cases that they have been doing end of year assessments in writing, reading, Maths and Science! All of the staff are very impressed and proud of the amazing effort that they have all put in! The results of the assessments help inform future planning and learning opportunities and identify where children, or groups of children need additional support or more challenge. The children in Y4 took part in the national Multiplication Check tests, that are optional this year, but will be compulsory from June 2022. Again, they did really well and the teachers were super impressed!

Also around school this week, nursery children have been finding out about the smells and tastes of different foods from around the world. Reception children visited the canal as part of their topic on water. Year 1 classes have been finding out interesting facts about St Paul's Cathedral to make information booklets, and Year 3 have been recreating their own brilliant interpretations of the painting, 'The Great Wave off Kanagawa'. Year 5 classes have continued their work on trade across the world, and Year 6 have been busy learning lines and rehearsing their end of year show!

Tuesday 22nd June was Windrush Day and Year 4 took part in 'Windrush and beyond' online workshops run by Hackney Museum. They were also treated to a special assembly by Chris who told them about his life and experiences growing up in London. So another very busy week!
