The weather has been glorious this week, and the staff and children have been making the most of being outdoors by going out in the local area. They visited local parks for science and PE lessons, and also went out in the local area for art and design activities and geography and history sessions. The children have also enjoyed being outside in the playground for story sessions.

We are still using the smaller outdoor space that is timetabled all day to make sure that all of the children get a share of the playground at least twice each day. Just to reiterate again, the children and staff have been amazing in navigating this difficult situation and have made the most of their time outdoors.

Following on from last week's very busy week, I wanted to say another huge 'thank you' to you all for the amazing fundraising effort and community spirit generated over our Day for Ukraine and for Comic Relief. Also, a huge thanks to all of the children and staff who made such an effort to wear bright and mismatched socks for Down Syndrome Awareness Day on Monday. Another thank you so much to all the parents who met their child/ren's teacher during online Parents Evening this week.
