Each child received this as a prize as Millfields won the cross Hackney competition.

This week, 14 pupils from across the school and the Autism Resource Provision visited Kench Hill, near Tenterden in Kent. This is an annual residential trip that gives the pupils from the ARP an amazing opportunity to be away from home, develop their independence skills and to experience lots of new and exciting activities such as feeding animals on the farm, learning how to climb on the climbing wall and also visiting the beach, the local swimming pool and bowling alley. Thank you to all the staff who have given up their time this week to support this trip.

There have also been lots of class trips this week. As part of the RE enrichment curriculum, Year 2 visited St Monica's RC Church on Tuesday as part of their work on Christianity, while Year 3 classes visited Walford Road Synagogue as part of their unit of work on Judaism. The children all enjoyed the opportunity and the experience and it has made their RE learning more relevant. As part of our Art curriculum enrichment, Year 6 classes visited the Futurism Workshop at The Estorick Collection. The children were amazed by the works that they saw. Thank you to Naomi and Rebecca for organising these visits.

Also this afternoon we have some of our Year 6 skilled debaters visiting the Olive School to take part in a debate on 'This House believes school holidays are too long and should be shortened!' chaired by the Speaker of Hackney Cllr Rosemary Sales. An update next week!
