The children in class have all settled very quickly back into their learning, and new topics, and some new routines have been introduced. Year 6 visited the Hackney Museum to round off their work on Black History month. Some of the Y5 and Y6 children had the opportunity to visit the Royal Festival Hall on Wednesday as part of the Bright-Sparks concert: Symphonie Fantastique. The children had a wonderful time and really enjoyed the whole experience. Look out for more opportunities in the future. Four brilliant table tennis players -Sam, Sol, Otto and Zakariya represented the school at the Hackney competition on Wednesday and did really well for a first outing, coming 4th out of 10 schools. As you will know, the COP26 climate summit is taking place this week, and it has brought world leaders together, with the aim to prevent human activity from causing dangerous levels of climate change. In KS2 assemblies this week, we have been talking about the COP and the UN Rights of Child, Article 12 -respect for children's views. We reinforced that climate change is something that affects us all, and as children, they have the right to give their opinions about how we can help tackle climate change, and adults should listen and take them seriously. For over 50 years now, scientists have been noticing that climate change is happening much quicker, and this is influencing lots of living things all over the world, in forests, oceans, grasslands and lots of other natural habitats -we at Millfields agree it is time for action! The Education Minister has said today that schools must include work on climate change in their curriculum, but at Millfields, we have already been doing this work! Our Eco Champions from across the school work hard very week on very small things that can make a big difference. Today, some of them will be joining other children from across Hackney, in a climate change rally, outside Hackney Town Hall! Look out for photos and news next week!

Thank you to all the parents and carers who joined the PSA meeting today to start serious planning for the Christmas Fair that will be taking place on Friday 3rd December -save the date! Keep looking for more news on how you can help!
