What a Busy Week at Millfields!



It has been really busy at Millfields this week—we have taken part in STEM week activities, World book Day, International Women's day and Fairtrade Fortnight activities!

Firstly, well done to our cycling team for the results from their Velotrack race last Friday, and good luck to all our Y4 and Y5 riders today! We are still at the top of the league and are hoping that we can hold on until the end of the season and retain the title!

We have had a brilliant science and technology week working with Inspire on iDis-

cover Week. The week started with an assembly to get the children interested and enthused in the topics that they would be covering this week. All of the classes had visitors, special videos, workbooks and most had trips to support and enhance the fantastic science and technology work that has been going on in class this week. Nursery and Reception classes were tasked with finding out who stole the cake from their classroom. The children became forensic scientists and looked for clues and suspects to help lead them to who stole their cake! Year 1 looked at robots and machines, met scientists and engineers who visited the class, and used a Cubetto to programme and move robots in class. Year 2 were looking at the human body - brain, skeleton and all the parts that help the body to function. They met neuroscientists, physiotherapists, biologists and psychologists. Year 3 were looking at the food that we eat to function as humans. They visited a foodrelated food organisation like Spitalfields City farm or Ed's Bakery and then had visits from dietitians, food engineers and drinks technologists. Year 4 had a fantastic time looking at how lighting and sound engineers help theatre productions. The had visits from a range of production engineers and visited the National Theatre to show off their skills! Year 5 and Year 6 had a great time learning how to use the IT programme 'scratch' to design their own computer programme. They had visits from games designers and producers as well as a visit to Linklaters for Y5 and to Cancer Research HQ for the Y6 classes. There was also a Careers Carousel in Year 6; volunteers from a range of professions brought along props or equipment to demonstrate their jobs. All of the children have met people that do exciting STEM jobs-we hope that lots of the children at Millfields will be in these kind of jobs in the future. Thank you to Naomi for coordinating all the visitors, trips and activities this week. Please spend some time this weekend talking to your children about the work they have been doing and about all the amazing people they have met!

We had an amazing time yesterday celebrating World book Day! The theme of the day was Roald Dahl characters and the school was full of great costumes like 'Fantastic Mr Fox and the farmers, Matilda, Willy Wonka, The BFG, Esio Trot and The Enormous Crocodile! Thank you to all the staff, parents and pupils for really entering in to the spirit and making the day so enjoyable. Lots of classes also visited Pages Bookshop to spend their £1 book voucher

Thank you also to all the Reception parents who came to eat lunch with their children yesterday. Although the children were very noisy as they were excited by the day's activities, and the fact it was very windy outside, there were lots of satisfied customers!

Today we celebrated 'International Women's Day' by singing and promoting girls in sport—there were 2 football matches organised over lunchtime and great fun was had by everyone! All the children will be watching films with strong female characters on Thursday 21st March—a letter will follow in due course.

After school today, to mark the end of Fairtrade Fortnight, there will be a Fairtrade goods and cake sale, as well as a raffle—I hope to see you there spending your cash!

Finally, thank you to all the pupils and parents who visited the book Bus today—we are hoping to top up our library with the commission.
