Today the country began an official period of mourning after the sad news of the death of Queen Elizabeth II. Today in school, we postponed our planned activities that included the opening of the 'Belonging' mural, Play Street activities and Outdoor Day activities. Staff wore black to show their respect and we all gathered first thing to talk about what we would be doing today with the children to mark this day, that is truly, the end of an era. In assemblies, we shared information about the Queen's life, we shared many memorable moments including the Queen having tea with Paddington Bear during the Platinum Jubilee celebrations. We also talked about bereavement and how we all deal with the passing of loved ones in different ways, and how sometimes the death of someone else triggers our own grief from the past. Please speak with your child/ren about what they have learnt today and what they have talked about as it seems unlikely that they will not see all the media coverage.

Lateness and Attendance procedures

If your child should arrive at school late (after the bell) they must be marked in at the main reception. This ensures that they are marked into the register and we know they are here in case of evacuation etc.

<u>Please note:</u> no parent/carer may enter the main school due to safeguarding procedures. Children will need to make their own way from the office to their classrooms.

If your child is unable to attend school, please ensure you leave a message on the school attendance line by 8:15am on the first day of absence. This is a 24 hour message service. (Option 1 on the automated phone message)

Please clearly state your child's name, class, reason for their absence and when they can be expected to return to school. We operate a first day of absence calling system whereby if your child is absent and we haven't been notified, we will call you to ask for an explanation.

It is our duty as a school to ensure good attendance of all pupils. Any children whose attendance or punctuality is of concern will be referred to the Education Attendance Officer for further support. Mill-fields Community School attendance has always been very good and we would like to thank you all for your support in ensuring your child attends school regularly and punctually.

Mobile Phones in School

Please note:

- Pupils remain responsible for all of their personal effects whilst at school. Mobile phones are not allowed in school. The school takes no responsibility for mobile phones and accepts no responsibility for replacing lost, stolen or damaged mobile phones.
- There is no reason why a pupil needs to have in their possession or use a mobile phone during the school day.
- Parents are reminded that in cases of emergency the school office remains a vital and appropriate point of contact and can ensure your child is reached quickly and assisted in any appropriate way.
- Pupils are advised that, if in exceptional circumstances agreed by the Headteacher, they bring a mobile phone onto the school grounds during the school day, the phone should be handed in to the school office. The phone can be collected at the end of the day. The phone is stored at the owners risk and school will accept no responsibility for replacing lost, stolen or damaged phones.
