

PUPIL PREMIUM STRATEGY 2017-18

The Government believes that the Pupil Premium is the best way to address the current underlying inequalities between children eligible for free school meals (FSM) and their wealthier peers by ensuring that funding to tackle disadvantage reaches the pupils who need it most. The Pupil Premium Grant is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) or have ever been eligible for FSM in the last 6 years, as well as children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months and pupils with parents in regular armed forces. Pupil Premium Grant provides funding to support raising the attainment of all disadvantaged pupils and closing the gap with their peers.

The PPG per pupil for 2017 to 2018 is as follows:

In the financial year 2017-18, the pupil premium is set at £1320 for pupils in year groups reception to year 6 recorded as Ever 6 FSM. The final figures were calculated using the January 2017 school census data. Millfields Community School received £262,360 for the financial year 2016-17 and is set to receive £270,280 for the financial year 2017-18.

We use a range of formative and summative assessment methods to gather pupil information for each child. The pupil information held on the school assessment database that tracks individuals' progress throughout their time at Millfields will be the main part of our evaluation process. In addition we will be monitoring other factors such as attendance and punctuality, parental involvement, evaluations from specific projects, such as 'Forever Curious', along with. how well all opportunities and initiatives are accessed by the identified pupils.

At Millfields, we have high aspirations and ambitions for all of our children and we believe that no child should be left behind. We strongly believe that it is not about where you come from but your passion and thirst for knowledge, and your dedication and commitment to learning that make the difference between success and failure, and we are determined to ensure that our children are given every chance to realise their full potential. Pupil premium funding represents a significant proportion of our budget and we have a policy that outlines how we will ensure it is spent to maximum effect. We believe in creating a range of learning experiences that ensure enrichment opportunities for all children.

Our Principles:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all of the pupils
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, this includes ensuring that the compound needs of disadvantaged pupils are adequately assessed and addressed
- In making provision for disadvantaged pupils, we recognise that not all pupils who receive free school meals will be disadvantaged
- We also recognise that not all pupils who are disadvantaged are registered or qualify for free school meals. We reserve the right to allocate the Pupil Premium funding to support any pupil or groups of pupils the school has legitimately identified as being disadvantaged.
- Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals. Limited funding and resources means that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium interventions at one time.
- Our work through the pupil premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, aiming for children to make at least expected progress against others nationally
- Pupil premium resources will also be used to ensure increasing numbers of more-able children receiving PPG achieve greater depth at the end of KS1 and KS2
