Sometimes we make things to help us learn more about the topic we're learning. We made woven baskets and an African pancake from Ghana that was made with plantain.




My favourite thing about topic lessons is the writing we do. I think topic could be better if we could learn even more everyday.



Some people think the Vikings were very violent but other people think they were just trying to survive. We compared the evidence we could find to see who was right.




I think topic could be better if we used more objects like you see in museums, especially in history lessons. I like seeing real objects instead of pictures.
