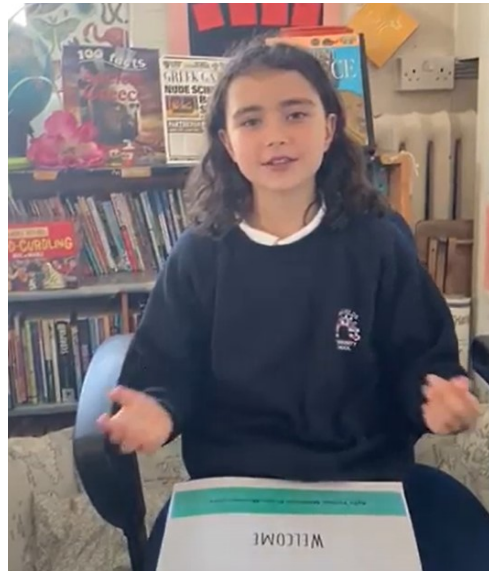

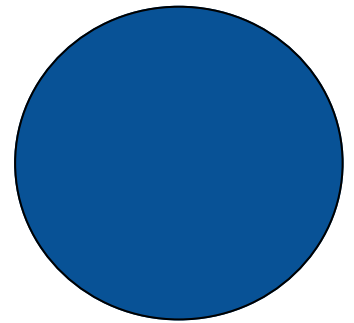
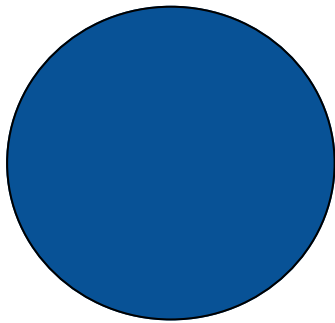


Deputy Leader: Leo S

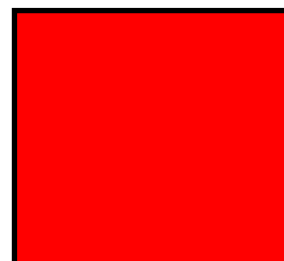
Deputy Leader: Bradley Z

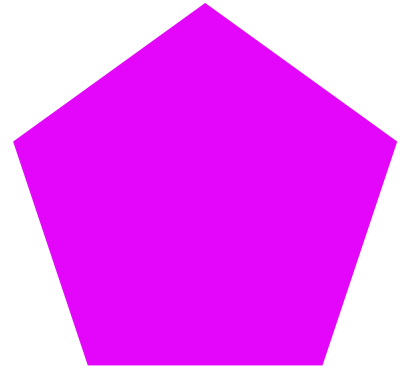
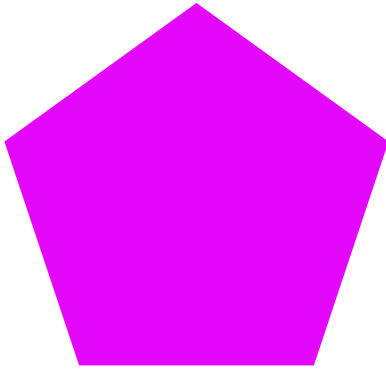


Deputy leader : Grace F

Around 2000 years ago, the first democracies emerged in Ancient Greece. However, after this, Kings and Queens would usually rule their countries. It wasn't until the 1600 to 1700's that people started to push to form governments. For example, in the British colonies of Northern America, that people started to feel particularly frustrated. Furthermore, there are also constitutional monarchies , like the United Kingdom. This is where the country has a King and Queen but actually they are just a figure head and don't have any real power.

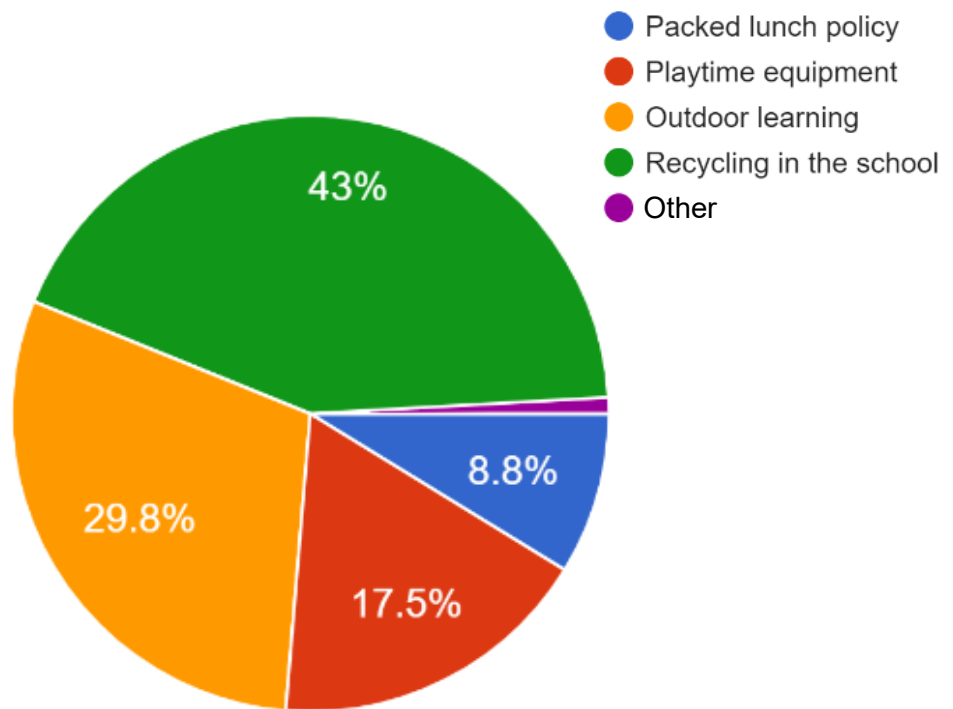
