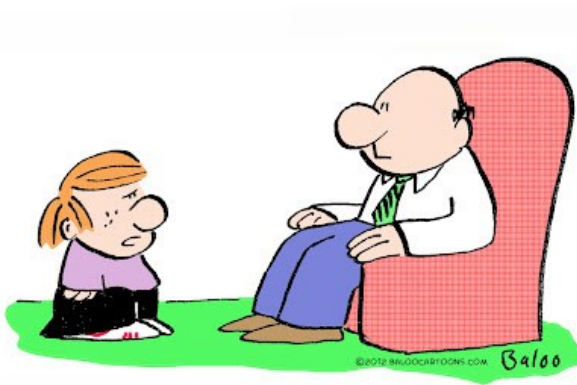

"If this family is a democracy, why can't I run for Father?"

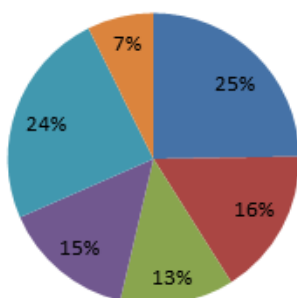

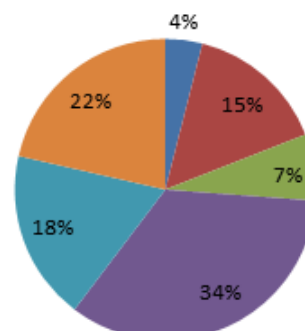

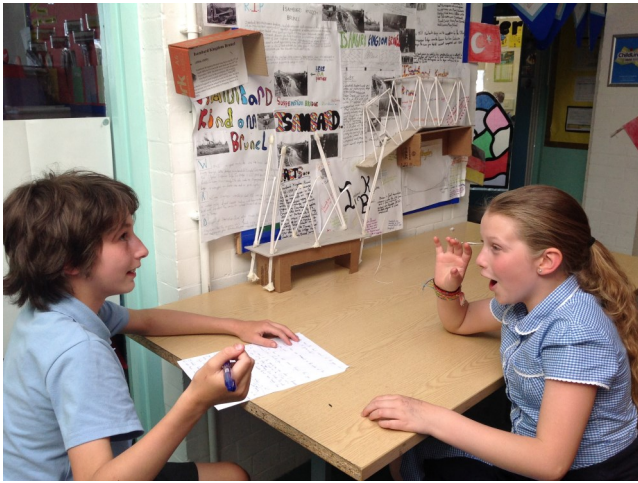
